By providing this notice, GeoLogics Corporation ("GeoLogics") does not waive any rights or defenses regarding the applicability of Maine law, the applicability of the Maine data event notification statute, or personal jurisdiction.

Nature of the Data Event

On October 16, 2024, GeoLogics learned that certain personal information may have been accessed or taken from its network between December 21 and 23, 2023. GeoLogics undertook a comprehensive review of the accessible dataset to determine whether it contained any sensitive information and to whom that information related. This included multiple rounds of address lookup efforts, methods of deduplication, and quality assurance efforts pertaining to impacted individuals in order to eradicate notice issues to the accessible data set and was completed on April 8, 2025.

The information that could have been subject to unauthorized access includes name, Social Security number, Passport number, financial account information, and driver's license or state identification number.

Notice to Maine Residents

On or about May 5, 2025, GeoLogics provided written notice of this incident to sixteen (16) Maine residents. Written notice is being provided in substantially the same form as the letter attached here as *Exhibit A*.

Other Steps Taken and To Be Taken

Upon discovering the event, GeoLogics moved diligently to investigate and respond to the incident, assess the security of GeoLogics systems, and identify individuals whose personal information may be involved. Further, GeoLogics notified federal law enforcement regarding the event. GeoLogics also worked to implement additional safeguards and training to its employees. GeoLogics is providing access to credit monitoring services for one (1) year, through Equifax, to individuals whose personal information was potentially affected by this incident, at no cost to these individuals.

Additionally, GeoLogics is providing individuals with guidance on how to better protect against identity theft and fraud. GeoLogics is providing individuals with information on how to place a fraud alert and security freeze on one's credit file, the contact details for the national consumer reporting agencies, information on how to obtain a free credit report, a reminder to remain vigilant for incidents of fraud and identity theft by reviewing account statements and monitoring free credit reports, and encouragement to contact the Federal Trade Commission, their state Attorney General, and law enforcement to report attempted or actual identity theft and fraud.

GeoLogics is providing written notice of this incident to relevant state regulators, as required, and to the three major credit reporting agencies, Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion.
